Candidates must complete the online nomination form. Once submitted, candidates will receive a PDF of the information provided via email. The PDF needs to be signed by two P&C Office Bearers (not the applicant) and returned with the P&C meeting minutes at which the nomination motion was voted on and accepted, a copy of the candidate's P&C membership receipt and either an Education Department Screening Clearance no older than 6 months or evidence that the clearance application has been submitted, to the WACSSO office by noon, Friday 6 September 2024. Term/By Election Information

Timetable for Elections

Nominations Close: 12 Noon, Friday 6 September 2024* Ballot Closes & Declaration of Elections: 12 Noon, Friday 25 October 2024

Eligibility

The nominee must be a financial member of a school organisation. The nominating school organisation must be a WACSSO affiliate from within the electorate.

Nominations

All nominations are required to be on the official 'nomination form' which is included in the election package provided by WACSSO.

Please ensure the following are provided:

- Nominee's full name;
- Name of nominee's school organisation;
- · Electorate for which nominating;
- Signature of the President and Secretary of school organisation or members acting in this capacity;
- A short history of the nominee's qualifications, attainments, and aims;
- A completed National Criminal History Check
 - Apply online only at <u>www.education.wa.edu.au/ncchc</u>
- The P&C Meeting Minutes at which the nomination was accepted; and
- A copy of the nominee's P&C membership receipt.

Signed Nomination forms must be lodged with the WACSSO office by the due date noted above.

Ballot Process

If a postal ballot becomes necessary, i.e. when more than one nomination is received for any electorate, then each association in that electorate is entitled to cast one vote for the candidate of its choice. The casting of the vote should be decided upon at a properly constituted meeting of the association.

Communications

An email will be sent out to the email address we have on file for Vice Presidents and Secretaries to advise that the Councillor election process has begun. A reminder email will also be sent 2 weeks before the closing date for nominations.

Term of Office Commences

Where there is a sitting Councillor, the term of office commences on 1 June 2024. Where there is no sitting Councillor and only one nomination is received, the nominee will be declared elected unopposed at the close of nominations and is entitled to take office immediately. A State Councillor elected at a by-election shall take office immediately for the balance of the original term of three (3) years applicable to that electorate.
